Matriculation Requirements for the BSc in HTM

- Standard forms of matriculation
 Applicant must possess an Associate degree issued by the CCCJ. It should be noted that the qualifying degree must be in an area relevant to the intended programme of study. Applicants who fail to meet this criterion will be required to complete the necessary
 - bridging courses at the Associate degree level prior to being afforded acceptance.
- 2. Alternate forms of articulation a. A current student who has ended the final semester of a CCCJ Associate degree programme and trailing no more than six (6) credits.
 - a. The following conditions shall apply.
 - i. The qualifying degree must be in an area relevant to the intended programme of study.
 - ii. The outstanding credits cannot be from a first-year course.
 - iii. The outstanding credits cannot be from a course leading to a specialization/major.
 - b. Equivalent qualification(s) as determined by the CCCJ
 - c. Mature Status as determined by the CCCJ

MATRICULATION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ASC IN HTM

An applicant seeking entry to the Applied Associate in Hospitality and Tourism Management programme must possess

- 1. Five (5) CSEC subjects including English 'A', (Basic Matriculation Requirements)
- 2. one of the five (5) passes must be in Mathematics (Programme Matriculation Requirements)

Basic Matriculation Requirements

There are **two (2)** methods by which an applicant can meet the Basic Matriculation Requirements; these are classified as Standard forms of matriculation and Alternate forms of matriculation.

1. Standard forms of matriculation

An applicant **MUST** have a minimum of **five (5)** passes in subjects at CSEC or GCE O'Level **including** English 'A' (CSEC) **or** English Language (GCE O'Level) and CSEC Mathematics

2. Alternate forms of matriculation

- Equivalent qualification(s) as determined by the CCCJ
- Mature Status as determined by the CCCJ
- Level 3 HEART NVQJ Certification

PROGRAMME DURATION

The programme may be offered as follows:

Schedule Duration Days Offered

Full-time Four (4) semesters (2 years) Weekdays, evenings and weekends.

Flexibility is applied based on preference of target group.

Part-time Six (6) semesters (3 years or 2 summers)
